	Rae Caro opened the meeting in prayer. Robert Lawrance welcomed	
	everybody and briefly outlined the changes to the MINE group of parishes. A	
	representative from St Michael's expressed concerns that they had had	
	changes imposed on them without consultation. It was felt that the Clergy	
	and the Churchwardens had been consulted but not the congregation. It was	
	stressed that due process had been followed and that everything had been	
	agreed by the MINE council and the Diocese. Representatives from St Silas	
	said they had been fully consulted.	
1.	Parish Share for 2020	
	The Budget Consultation Document had been circulated prior to the meeting.	
	A further document has been produced reflecting concerns raised by the	
	consultation.	
	After discussion the Deanery Synod agreed that they would try to pay the 2%	
	increase in line with option 2 although concerns were expressed as to	
	whether it would be possible.	
2.	Parish Giving Scheme feedback and evaluation of our experience	
	The Parish Giving Scheme uses Direct Debit rather than Standing Order. People who	
	use it are invited to increase their giving annually. The Gift Aid comes back every	
	month. It makes the role of the Treasurer easier as it reduces the administrative	
	burden. In order to use it the PCC has to join the scheme. Churches who are using it	
	have found it a positive experience.	
3.	News of appointment of Generous Giving Officers	
	Joanne Christie and Andrew Tinkler have been appointed as Generous Giving	
	Officers. The posts have been funded by Ecclesiastical Insurance as a gift to the	
	Diocese. Joanne and Andrew would be happy to talk to parishes and Deanery Synod
